SCHOOL & COMMUNITY

Founded in 1969, Saint John Vianney High School is a co-ed Catholic high school operated by the Diocese of Trenton. Located in Holmdel, New Jersey, the school resides forty-five miles south of New York City, in Monmouth County.

SJV enrolls approximately 850 students in grades 9-12. **The Class of 2026 has 218 students.**

ACADEMIC OVERVIEW

All students must accumulate a minimum of 150 credits to graduate. The instructional curriculum is designed to provide strong college preparation with Honors, Advanced Placement, Dual Enrollment, and elective enrichment courses available in all disciplines. SJV is on block scheduling offering 78-minute periods. The 4x4 class schedule enrolls students in 4 classes, which meet every day for 90 days, except for Advanced Placement courses which are taught for the full year.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT ACADEMY

The AP Academy provides students the opportunity to receive the maximum amount of college credits they can while in high school by taking Advanced Placement and dual enrollment courses during their four years. There are fourteen College Board approved Advanced Placement courses and numerous dual enrollment courses.

Students enrolled in the AP Academy can choose a Liberal Arts or Science/Math track.

BUSINESS ACADEMY

Introduced in September 2022, the Business Academy provides the opportunity for students to earn 39 college credits in partnership with The University of Delaware, Georgian Court University and Brookdale Community College. Thus, they can present two final transcripts to their accepting four-year colleges. *Saint John Vianney High School is distinguished as a satellite campus of Brookdale Community College.*

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

SJV offers AP courses beginning in 9th grade. AP courses are taught for the full year, and each course takes up two course periods because of block scheduling. This limits the number of AP classes a student can take in a given year.

Students can only take a max of 3 AP classes per year. The total number of AP's a student can take throughout their 4 years at SJV is 9.

AP EXAM RESULTS (MAY 2025)

136 students took 194 AP Exams in 19 subjects. Students enrolled in an AP course are required to sit for the exam.
